This program awards maximum credit for an associate degree from Cuyahoga Community College, streamlining completion of a bachelor's degree from IWU. IWU will accept the transfer of your ENTIRE Associate Degree and ALL prior credits provided they meet the following criteria:

- Credits are from a regionally accredited institution •
- A grade of "C" or higher was earned •
- The courses were 100-level or higher (not pre-college, remedial, developmental, credits through testing or assessed • learning)

All students must complete:

- A minimum of 120 semester credits (combined Tri-C and IWU) •
- Meet all residency requirements (30 credits for IWU)
