Cooperative Education ("co-op")

Cooperative Work Experience ("co-op") is a paid employment which relates to an individual student's occupational objectives. The experience is coordinated by a member of the professional staff of the college who assists the student in planning the experience, visits the site of the experience for a conference with the student and his/her supervisor at least once during the semester, and assigns the course grade to the student after appropriate consultation with the employer/supervisor.

One (1) course credit shall be awarded to each student participating in a cooperative work experience for each 12 clock hours of scheduled employment per standard week or 180 clock hours per standard academic semester. A maximum of 9 semester credits may be earned in cooperative work experience, or in any combination of cooperative work experience, field experience, and practicum over the two-year period of the program.

Ohio Board of Regents Directive 2010-016, March 18, 2010

Statement of Understanding:

(Student to initial each box below)

- I understand that Co-ops are academic courses. My work will be evaluated by my instructor and cooperative work experience employer, and I will receive a course grade.
- I understand that the Cuyahoga Community College Cooperative Education Program is not a job placement service, it is an academic program.
- I understand that to qualify for a cooperative work experience, I **MUST** register for the corresponding academic course section and pay all applicable course tuition and fees each semester. I will receive instructions from my co-op instructor and/or the Office of Career Services on when and how to register. As an academic course, my co-op falls under the same Financial Aid eligibility guidelines and rules as any other academic course at Cuyahoga Community College.

I understand that I am expected to register and pay for the Cooperative Education course section **BEFORE** I begin my co-op work experience each semester. If I am applying an existing work experience toward Cooperative Education credit, I must register and pay for the Cooperative Education course section as soon as the Course Registration Number (CRN) is created and made available to me for registration.

I understand that if I do not register and pay for the Cooperative Education course section arranged for me through the Office of Career Services each semester, I can be removed from my co-op work experience at any time, with no obligation on the part of Cuyahoga Community College or my co-op employer to reimburse me for any future lost wages or other compensation of any kind.

I understand that I am not eligible for unemployment compensation at the end of the cooperative work experience. If I apply for unemployment compensation, my cooperative work experience employer will have *de facto* cause to reject my claim.

I have read and I understand this Cooperative Education – Student Application of Interest, including the Statement of Understanding. I agree to comply with all rules and requirements of the Cuyahoga Community College Cooperative Education Program, including those described herein. I authorize the Career Services Specialist to release to prospective co-op work experience employers information relating to my academic performance and Cooperative Education records when, in the judgment of the Career Services staff, this information will be of value to my co-op or career goals. I understand that submittal of this application does not guarantee that I will be offered or placed into a co-op work experience.
