There's a growing **DEMAND** for **REALTIME COURT REPORTERS.**

The Realtime Writing Mentoring program promotes student success through mentoring and experiential learning. It includes year-round instruction in the use of a steno machine or voice recognition technology, the opportunity for mentoring stipends* (upon enrollment and as goals are met while students progress through the program), and numerous support services. While this initiative is open to all students, our focus is geared toward recruiting and training African-American, Hispanic and male students.

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Students must:

Set the goal of spending at least three hours per day or 21 hours per week practicing on the steno machine or using voice recognition technology outside of class.

Successfully complete the courses required for each tier within the Realtime Writing Mentoring Program to qualify for the corresponding mentoring stipend.

Achieve a minimum grade of "C" in all courses.

Attend all classes.

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**Students who complete these requirements will shadow a local professional court reporter during their coursework and receive a \$2,000 stipend during the first year of engagement and \$2,500 during the second year (up to two years).*
