You must meet **one** of the requirements listed for your applicant category.

New Tri-C Student (completed no more than one semester at Tri-C)

PSEOP student w/HS senior or junior status

- P/ACT of 26 or higher, or P/SAT combined minimum score of 1800, or
- Honors level on English or math placement exam

Recent high school graduate (within past 5 years)

- Top 10% of high school graduating class, or 3.7 or higher high school GPA, or
- ACT composite score of 26 or higher, or SAT combined minimum score of 1800, or
- Honors level on English or math placement exam

All Other: Non-recent high school graduate (over 5 yrs ago), GED or home schooled, transfer

- Honors level on English or math placement exam, or
- 3.5 GPA, minimum of 12 college-level credit hrs from another college/university or combined with your Tri-C college-level credits (include copy of non-Tri-C transcripts)

Continuing Tri-C Student (anyone who has completed more than one semester at Tri-C)

- 3.5 GPA, min. 12 college-level credit hours, or
- 3.5 GPA, min. 9 college-level credit hrs. and honors level on English or math placement exam

Special Consideration: Include Essay (see #6 on page 2)

Honors Program Application – General Information

Honors Program Mission: The Cuyahoga Community College Honors Program provides an academically challenging and enriching learning experience for highly motivated, intellectually talented and academically prepared students in order to better develop their potential as learners, citizens and leaders in a complex and culturally diverse world.

Additional Application Requirements and Notes:

1. All applications require a letter of recommendation from someone who can attest to your academic performance and potential: if you have taken classes at Tri-C, this should be from one of your Tri-C instructors; if you are a recent high school graduate who has not taken classes at Tri-C, this should be from a high school teacher or counselor. If you are in a category of new student for whom it would be difficult or impossible to get a letter of recommendation (e.g., non-recent HS graduate, graduate of a foreign high school, home schooled, GED), you may apply for Special Consideration and be admitted on a conditional basis.
2. If your acceptance is based on ACT or SAT scores, high school GPA or class rank, or coursework from another institution, you must include verifying documentation with your application.
3. “College-level” credit hours refer to 1000- and 2000-level coursework, or comparable if from another institution. It does not include developmental/remedial coursework. However, cumulative GPAs include all coursework. When acceptance is based on your having earned a minimum 3.5 GPA on college-level coursework, it is also expected that your cumulative GPA will be at least 3.5.
4. You must take the Tri-C English and math placement tests prior to applying for the Honors Program. Even if your identified membership qualification is not honors placement on one of these tests, if you place lower than ENG 1010 on the English placement test and do not place into math honors, you must apply to the program as a Continuing Tri-C Student.
5. Those who do not meet the relevant criteria under the appropriate New Student category may apply later as a Continuing Tri-C Student.
6. **Special Consideration:** In some situations, a New or Continuing student who does not meet the relevant criteria may be admitted to the program on a conditional basis. In addition to the situation mentioned in Note 1 above, there are other situations where this may apply, such as a student who has a significant gap in attendance at Tri-C and whose more recent work reflects honors-level performance. If in doubt, talk to the Honors Program Director or a Campus Honors Coordinator. If you are applying for special consideration, include an essay of approximately 500 words explaining why you want to be in the Honors Program and why you think you can be a successful honors student. You must also meet briefly with the Honors Program Director or a Campus Honors Coordinator to submit your application.
