



Financial Information For Foreign Students

Before an international student is admitted to Cuyahoga Community College, the student or student's sponsor must provide documentation that the necessary funds are available for tuition and living expenses. Listed below are estimates for these expenses. The expenses of any individual student may vary from the figures below, however these are average costs each student should be prepared to meet.

The College estimates the student's average costs for each academic year to be:

Tuition and fees	\$6,740 (based on 15 credits)
Living expenses	5,100
Other	3,650

TOTAL ESTIMATED ANNUAL BUDGET: \$15,490

- This estimate does not include expenses required if issuing I-20's for dependents. If a student wishes to include family members, an additional \$3,000 is needed for the spouse and an additional \$2,000 is needed for each child.
- The College does not provide financial assistance to international students nor do we provide on-campus housing. To assist with cultural adjustment and with emotional and financial support, it is recommended that students have a local contact or sponsor who can assist with finding housing and transportation.
- Students having more than one sponsor must submit required financial documents from each sponsor. Although only one year of expenses is needed to meet the financial requirement, it is assumed a comparable amount will be available for each year of study.
- Medical care in the United States is very expensive. Each international student (and any accompanying dependents) is expected to purchase health insurance to meet medical expenses while in the U.S. unless the student is already covered by insurance valid in the U.S. Information on several health insurance plans can be obtained from your International Student Advisor.
