On March 27th, the 33rd annual OHIO TRIO Student Leadership Conference was held at Kent State University. This year's conference, with the theme "Building a Better Future," was attended by nearly 300

students and staff from TRIO programs all over the state of Ohio. The day started with a welcome from OHIO TRIO President and KSU Upward Bound Director, Thomas Jefferson, followed by speakers from two departments at Kent State. Afterwards, all of the students participated in a fun icebreaker. Students chose four breakout sessions to attend. Sessions were presented by professionals from across the state and covered topics on passion, leadership skills, financial literacy, financial aid, higher education, personal image and growth, overcoming challenges, and much more. Conference attendees were treated to a dynamic keynote speaker during lunch, Derek Felton. Derek spoke of his own experiences, as well as the success stories of famous leaders. Derek also highlighted students' ability to drive their own future. When asked about his experience at this year's OHIO TRIO Student Leadership Conference, one student said, "I learned to be more open and never give up on my passion." Another student reported that the conference "gave (her) a lot to think about for the future and life itself."

I am in my early 40s and it feels good to not be terrified of Math anymore. I am happy to say that I am much more confident in my Math abilities due to the support and encouragement that I have received from the staff in the Student Support Services Department.


I've made a conscious decision to surround myself with those who want to see me succeed. I consider the staff within the TRIO program a part of my success team. Who's on your success team?





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Super Student Spotlight Sherdena Dixon



JS: Congratulations! You're graduating with an Associate of Applied Business degree from Tri-C. What do you plan to do next?

SD: I have already transferred to the College of Urban Affairs at Cleveland State to get a

bachelor's degree. My goal is to become the administrator for my church and its community outreach projects.

JS: You've come a long way, Sherdena. Let's go back to your childhood or youth. Where shall we start?

SD: I ran away from home when I was 10 years old. My parents were on drugs. One day my mother said, "We're moving. Get your stuff." My dad was out of town. I thought he would be joining us, but my parents were splitting up. I ran away to my dad's house. I walked the whole way, from West 25th and Lorain to East 90th and St. Clair.

It was a nasty divorce with dual custody. I kept running away. I was 12 years old when I had my first child. I was looking for love and attention. I was in a detention home from ages 12 to 14 for running away and disobedience. At school I got mostly C's, D's, and F's.

By age 19, I had five sons and one daughter. With each pregnancy I developed toxemia. After the 6th pregnancy my kidneys failed, and I went on dialysis.

JS: That's a pretty grim beginning. Did your life improve then?

SD: No, it got worse. I started passing bad checks. In December of 2003, I was sentenced to two years in the penitentiary at Marysville. My mother and my sister took over the care of my children. When my sister came to visit me, she told me that the children were not doing well. My 14 year old daughter was not eating and had lost a lot of weight. I was miserable. My children were very important to me.

One day as I sat on my bunk the realization came to me, "My life is unmanageable."

When I was released in October of 2005, I got a job at McDonalds and my children came to live with me. In January of 2006 I was approved for SSI. I am appreciative of a family counseling program sponsored by the Jewish Federation. We participated in family activities that improved family structure.

In 2009 I was called in for a kidney transplant. People in my church helped care for the kids. They visited me in the hospital. They cooked for me when I came home. I learned that blood isn't the only thing that makes a family. I prayed, "What can I do to show God my gratitude?"

I decided to go to college. I didn't have a high school diploma or a GED. I took the Ability to Benefit test at Tri-C and passed. I joined the ACCESS program for Students with Disabilities. They referred me to Student Support Services TRIO, and you became my adviser.

In May I will graduate with an associate degree. Also I will attend the GED graduation. I didn't need the GED to get the associate degree, but it was very important to me to finish high school. It was a reprieve from all the things I've done.

JS: I'm very proud of you and your achievements, Sherdena. Because of your experiences, both positive and negative, you will be a gift to your church and your community.
