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Question 1

Reflecting on our Vision: Consider what you just heard about Tri-C needing to change - what aspect of that message resonates with you the most, and why?

Summary

Students express the need for better career guidance, engaged and knowledgeable instructors, and accessible counseling services. They seek more tutoring for specific programs, expanded course offerings, and improved resources for mental health and financial support, especially for international students. There is a call for spending transparency, better communication between staff and students, and more extracurricular spaces. Concerns include dissatisfaction with current food services, the process of creating club events, and the need for programs catering to older students and those with children. Students desire practical training and education in trades, and better support for international students and those with learning disabilities.

Summary

Students are requesting more study spaces, especially at Westshore and Western Campus, better access to tutoring and support services, and free graduation caps and gowns. They seek improved communication with student engagement and easier website access, more support for international students, and help with language barriers. Additional feedback opportunities, high school transition programs, and better teacher-student communication are needed. There are calls for life skill classes, daycare, better food programs, and more classes at multiple campuses. Students also want accessible office hours, insurance programs, and more programs outside of campus. They emphasize the need for passionate teachers who understand students' external stressors and suggest reviewing successful teaching strategies. Specific requests include Spanish math tutors and home economics classes.
