

COMMENCEMENT CEREMONY

Petition to graduate by Friday, April 4

Doors open for students at 12:30 p.m. Students will enter through Medical Mutual Gate A only. Please arrive **in academic regalia** no later than 1:30 p.m. You will be directed to your robing location after signing in. Only graduates are permitted in this area.

Do not bring personal belongings (e.g., purses, coats) to the robing location, as they are not secured. You may not march with your personal belongings. Exceptions are for medical necessity (i.e. insulin).

Academic regalia is required in order to participate in Commencement. Appropriate attire is required under your gown. This does not include jeans, shorts, T-shirts, or athletic shoes.

The ceremony will last approximately two hours.

Stoles

Guests

Admission to the ceremony does not require a ticket; however, seating is on a first-come, first-served basis. Doors to the Wolstein Center open at 2 p.m.

Guests may enter through any gate entrance. Visit the information table at Medical Mutual Gate A for assistance with special accommodations.

Bag Policy

Guests may bring manufactured diaper bags, medical bags, clutches or fanny packs not exceeding 4.5" x 6.5" or a clear tote bag (vinyl, plastic or PVC) not exceeding 12" x 6" x 12". All other bag types are prohibited.

Ceremony

Turn off your cellphone and other electronic devices before the ceremony.

Students will be recognized by name and academic honor as they walk across the stage. Return to your seat afterward and *remain there for the duration of the ceremony*.

Diploma/certificate covers will be presented during the ceremony.

Diplomas

You can expect to receive your diploma within two months of the ceremony. Diplomas, certificates and letters will be sent via USPS to the address on file with the College's Office of the Registrar.

Photographs

A professional photograph is taken of each graduate as they proceed across the stage. You will receive a proof of your photo along with ordering information about seven days after the ceremony. Contact <u>Grad Images</u> for more information.
