Step 1: Do you have a Tri-C student number (S-Number)?

- **Yes, and I got it within the past year:** Proceed to Step 2.
- **Yes, but I got it more than a year ago:** Complete the online noncredit registration form to update your profile and activate your S-Number before registering. Visit tri-c.edu/NCRRegistration.
- **No:** Complete the online noncredit registration form to receive your S-Number (it will appear onscreen once submitted). Visit tri-c.edu/NCRRegistration.

Step 2: Check your profile status.

Visit <https://portal2.tri-c.edu/UserStatus>, and enter your S-Number and password.

Use your student email, which starts with your S-Number (e.g., S12345678@acad.tri-c.edu).

Step 3: Check your profile status.

Step 6: Set up your authentication.

Once your password is established, you will be required to set up multi-factor authentication (MFA) to access certain Tri-C applications and tools. Federal regulations require the College to use MFA. What Is my Tri-C space?

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
