



Associate of Arts Degree Art Therapy Emphasis

The Art program's Art Therapy track at Cuyahoga Community College (Tri-C®) offers a variety of opportunities for students who enjoy art and psychology and are interested in helping those with mental health, physical and emotional challenges.

Coursework at Tri-C prepares students for transfer opportunities on the path to a rewarding career as an art therapist or creative arts specialist. Art therapists work in a variety of settings, assisting people who have undergone trauma, loss, illness or emotional disturbance or struggled with depression, developmental disabilities, addictions and more. Tri-C also offers a short-term Creative Art Therapy award document option to those interested.

Through an articulation agreement with Ursuline College, students can seamlessly transfer to complete a bachelor's degree, and have the option to apply to the master's program in Art Therapy/Counseling. Students may also transfer to other area colleges and then apply to a master's program of their choice.

Art therapy has seen substantial growth in the past decade. Potential earnings can vary from \$35,000 to \$65,000 annually. Those who have doctoral degrees, licensure and qualify to conduct private practice can potentially earn \$75 to \$150 per hour.
