# Is there any difference between the Online Associate of Arts and the traditional Associate of Arts (AA)?

The only difference between the two is the modality of coursework. The Online AA has the same degree requirements as the traditional AA and results in the same earned degree. No online designation will appear on a student's diploma or transcript.

## What are the entry requirements for the Online AA program?

To be accepted into the <u>Online Associate of Arts</u> program, students must complete the <u>Tri-C application</u>, be accepted as a student, and work through the full enrollment process.

#### Can I teach an Online AA course?

## Do Online AA students need to take all of their classes online, or can they opt to take some on campus?

Students in the Online AA program must complete at least 90% of their courses online. The remaining 10% can be completed on campus.
