Initial Login to my Tri-C space

1. Go to my Tri-C space
2. Click **“Password Tools and Assistance”**
3. Click **“Change Your Password”**
4. Enter your S-Number (S00000000) and click **“Continue”**
5. Enter your birthdate (mm/dd/yyyy) as your old password (no leading zeros for single-digit dates)
6. Create a new password containing a combination of letters and numbers (e.g., fluffy12)
7. Re-enter your new password and click **“Change”**
8. You will be redirected to my Tri-C space
9. Log in to your My Tri-C Account using your student email (S00000000@acad.tri-c.edu) and your new password

Applying to Tri-C

Our online-only application is free. Apply at tri-c.edu/apply. You will receive an email in one to seven business days informing you of your acceptance and providing your student number.

Former students who have not taken classes within the last three semesters must reapply.

Registration Information

Registration

Register online or in person in Admissions and Financial Services. Registration for classes will end the day before the first class meeting for 16-, 14-, 12- or 8-week courses (10-, 8- and 5-weeks for summer). Students are expected to be registered and attending class from the first scheduled meeting of the class period.

Program 60 Registration

Ohio residents age 60 and older may register for some credit and noncredit courses on a tuition-free, audit basis if space is available. Visit tri-c.edu/program60 for an enrollment checklist.

Enrolling for Audit or Pass/No Pass Option

Students can audit a course if space is available by completing an audit form or in person in Admissions and Financial Services. Audit course registration takes place during the first five business days of the part of term. The Pass/No Pass grade option must be selected no later than the last day to register.

Prerequisites

Course prerequisites are established by each department to ensure that the student has an adequate background to be successful in the course. A 'C' grade or higher is required in the prerequisite course. Successful completion of a prerequisite course will be checked at the time of registration.

Guaranteed Courses

The College is now offering "guaranteed" courses each semester. A guaranteed course provides you with assurance

that your course will not be cancelled due to lack of enrollment. Look for the "Guaranteed Course" attribute column when searching for course sections (CRNs) at registration.

Schedule Adjustment Period (Register/Drop/Add)

Students may adjust their schedule during the first week of the term but can only enter a class that has not held the first scheduled session if space is available. Exceptions must first be approved via the Late Registration form.

Registration Holds

Paying for College

Withdrawal Information

You are responsible for withdrawing from any course you choose not to attend. You can withdraw online through *my Tri C Space* (provided you have no registration holds) through the “Registration Dashboard”, by emailing Admissions and Enrollment Services, by fax or in person at any Admissions and Financial Services area. If you withdraw from your course(s), you may still be responsible for all or a percentage of the tuition charge. You can check your account status on *my Tri-C space* on the Student Self Service Card.

Refund Information

If you paid the tuition in full and have no other outstanding balance, your payment minus the percentage you are responsible for will be refunded to you. The refund process will begin two weeks after the start of term. For information on refunds and setting up your refund method, visit tri-c.edu/refund.

Residency

Fees charged at the College are based on the individual student’s residency status, designated as In-County, Out-of-County or Out-of-State. This status is determined at the point of admission. If this status changes while enrolled at the College, it is your responsibility to notify and submit documentation to Admissions and Enrollment Services by the 100% refund period for each term in order for the change to be effective for that term. Institutional Fee Schedule

Paying for College

Payment Options

Students are responsible for ensuring that all tuition and fees are paid at the time of registration. Payment arrangements include:

- Pay in full
- Set up a payment plan (one-time \$25 nonrefundable fee)
- Use financial aid (complete your FAFSA at fafsa.gov and stay in good standing)
- Use a third-party payer (submit a Third-Party Authorization Form — see tri-c.edu/sponsorinformation for more information)

Students can pay tuition and fees via:

- Check or money order (U.S. mail, in person or online).
- Master Card, Visa, American Express and Discover (in person or online). A 2.25% surcharge will be applied.
- Tri-C Installment Payment Plan (in person or online).
- 529 Payment (State College Savings Plan).
- International Payment (Log in to *my Tri-C space* and make a secure payment from any country, using any currency).

Student Financial Aid and Scholarships Apply Early!

Students are urged to apply for financial aid well in advance of the beginning of classes.

FAFSA applications are available online at fafsa.gov.

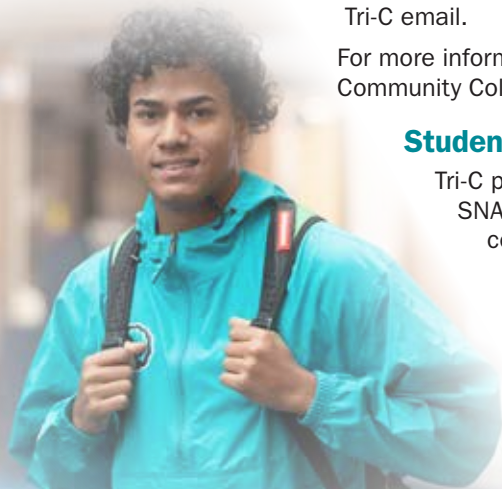
Students enrolling in Fall 2026, Spring 2027 and/or Summer 2027 semesters should complete and submit the 2026-2027 FAFSA application, along with all required documentation. For Fall 2026, apply by July 1, 2026 to ensure having your financial aid award before the start of the semester.

Financial aid opportunities are available in the form of scholarships, grants, loans and part-time employment. Eligibility and approval for all forms of financial aid should be determined at least six weeks prior to registration. Book lines of credit will be provided to students who have met all financial aid eligibility requirements, registered in applicable coursework for the term and met academic standards for financial aid purposes. Book lines of credit may be available at least one week before the start of the term for eligible students. All students receiving a book line of credit will be directly notified of availability and expiration through their Tri-C email.
