New college students may be required during their first semester to participate in GEN 1070, First Year Success Seminar, a one credit hour course. See a Tri-C Counselor for details.

Each semester is broken down into two 7-week terms. This is a four-semester program with no PLA. Malone University can award up to 29 credit hours for Prior Learning which can be applied to Liberal Arts and General Electives. Semesters can be Fall, Spring, or Summer. Program may begin in any semester. Total length of program is 18-24 months, depending on summer attendance

#### **Transfer Pathway Information**

This transfer pathway represents one example of how to complete an associate and bachelor degree. Students should work closely with advisors at both institutions to discuss options. An advisor can also assist students with developing a graduation plan for full- or part-time study.

Course sequence may change based on the individual needs of the student and schedule type required.

This program awards maximum credit for an associate degree from Cuyahoga Community College, streamlining completion of a bachelor's degree from Malone University, fulfilling most of the core requirements, and guaranteeing junior status.

### In order to graduate, all students must complete:

- A minimum of 120 semester credits (combined Tri-C and Malone University)
- Meet Malone University's residency requirement of 30 credit hours.
- Earn an overall g.p.a. of 2.0 and a major g.p.a. of 2.5.
