Since our first class arrived in 1963,

Tri-C has continuously evolved to meet the needs of its students and advance Northeast Ohio as a center for culture and commerce.

Each year, our approximately 3,000 faculty and staff play a vital role in guiding and educating tens of thousands of students who will become the workers, leaders and community pillars that propel this region forward.

As we embark on our seventh decade, we recognize that the need to evolve is greater than ever. How people view and consume education has changed as students must balance school, work and family responsibilities. Traditional classroom learning doesn't fit everyone's lifestyle.

The 2024-2025 academic year will bring some exciting changes as Tri-C continues to adapt.

We will implement a school-based academic structure to better align our programs, bringing together credit and non-credit courses to streamline the process of registering for classes, declaring a major, graduating and transferring to a four-year school.

We will introduce our first-ever bachelor's degree program, a Bachelor of Applied Science in Integrated Digital Manufacturing Engineering Technology. This new degree will position Tri-C as a valuable partner to Cuyahoga County's more than 1,600 manufacturing companies, employing nearly 70,000 people.

The students of today require colleges and universities to meet them where they are, offering flexible — but still comprehensive — education. Integrated pathways and personalized support help students complete their studies and ultimately find well-paying careers that allow them and their families to thrive.

Providing those opportunities is an ongoing objective for Tri-C and one we will continue to tirelessly pursue as one of this region's foremost educational institutions.

FACTS ABOUT CUYAHOGA COMMUNITY COLLEGE

Founded in 1963 as Ohio's first community college, Tri-C has provided high-quality, affordable education and programs to more than 1.2 million community members.

More than 1,000 credit courses are offered each semester in more than 200 career and technical programs. Tri-C also grants short-term certificates, certificates of proficiency and post-degree professional certificates.

More than 600 noncredit workforce and professional development courses are offered each year.

As the largest community college, Tri-C serves students at four campuses and at numerous off-campus sites strategically located throughout the county.



Tri-C has been recognized twice as an Aspen Prize Top 150 Community College. This biennial honor, which recognizes high achievement and performance in student outcomes, is the nation's signature recognition for community colleges.

In October 2023, Tri-C received its 11th INSIGHT Into Diversity Higher Education Excellence in Diversity (HEED) Award — a national honor recognizing U.S. colleges and universities that demonstrate an outstanding commitment to diversity and inclusion.

Tri-C was one of seven Ohio

schools — and the only community college in the state — to earn a 2023 HEED Award.

PROGRAMS

The College offers Associate of Arts and Associate of Science transfer degrees, as well as the first-ever bachelor's degree program: a Bachelor of Applied Science in Integrated Digital Manufacturing Engineering Technology.

Beginning with the fall 2024 semester, Tri-C credit and noncredit programs were organized into five academic schools. Students will be assigned to a school when they declare a major. Being part of a school will give students a sense of identity and community within the College while also providing a home base for all of their academic needs.

TRI-C STUDENTS

Tri-C serves more than 41,000 credit and noncredit students annually.

- 79% are enrolled part time
- 21% are enrolled full time
- 19% are enrolled in evening or weekend classes
- 94% are seeking an associate degree or taking courses to transfer to a four-year institution
- · 25% are focusing in areas related to health careers
- 73% are enrolled in technical job-training courses
- 11% are enrolled in business programs
- 33% are from outside the region



The average student takes 7.1 credit hours per semester.




FY25 General Fund Operating Revenue Total = \$222,160,000
