Mary Sender serves as a Professor and Program Manager of the Art Therapy Program at Cuyahoga Community College (Tri-C[®]). Ms. Sender has been employed at Tri-C since 1989, and has previously served in roles including Director and Program Manager for the Access program for students with disabilities and as an academic counselor. In total, she has more than 20 years of professional experience in academia, public and private organizations.

Prior to joining Tri-C, Ms. Sender served as Health Physical Education and Recreation Director at the Lakewood YMCA, and served as Activity Therapy Director at Northside Hospital in Youngstown where she created a program for the adult, adolescent and rehabilitation units consisting of art therapy, music therapy, physical therapy and movement groups.

Ms. Sender has excellent knowledge of Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973, and the Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990, and serves as a national spokesperson for the Learning Disability/Attention Deficit Hyperactivity Disorder (ADHD) population in post-secondary education. She also implemented the College Learning Disability program.

Ms. Sender earned a master's degree in counseling and art therapy from Ursuline College and a bachelor's degree in activity therapy and business with a minor in arts and health from The Ohio State University. She currently serves on the Buckeye Art Therapy Association Board; and, in 2008, served as Chair of Sponsorship for the National American Art Therapy Association Annual Conference. She also provides, reviews and obtains Continuing Education Units (CEU's) for social workers, counselors, nurses, activity therapists, art therapists and other professionals approved by the Ohio Counseling, Social Workers and Marriage and Family Therapy Board.

On a personal note, Ms. Sender is a talented dancer and won a Bronze Medal at the 1984 Olympics in Dance. She also enjoys photography, and some of her pieces are displayed in various art galleries in Ohio.
