Capital Bond Progress Report

Jan. 24th STEM Groundbreaking Western Campus

At Noon on January 24th, Tri-C broke ground on a 60,000 square foot STEM/IT addition to the Western Campus in Parma. This is the first of many projects resulting from the passage of Tri-C's Capital Bond in the November 2017

election. New science and IT labs will greet students when the \$34M facility opens in Fall 2019.

"The positive impact of the Bond Issue will be felt throughout Cuyahoga County, as we work to get 85% of the projects underway within the next three years," notes Cindy Leitson, Tri-C VP of Capital, Construction, and Facilities. <u>Details</u>



The strong and stable financial health of Cuyahoga Community College has led to elevated long-term bond ratings for the institution by the world's largest credit rating agencies. Standard & Poor's Global Ratings assigned its AA long-term rating and Moody's Investors Service its Aa1 long-term rating to the College's 2018 general obligation school facilities construction and improvement bonds.
