Career Spots

Whether students are looking for advice on the job search, resumes, cover letters, networking, interviewing, professional dress, experiential learning, or salary negotiation - <u>Career Spots</u> has a video for them. Students can access over 50 career advice videos, with nearly all of the videos being less than 5 minutes long.

Career Center Library

The Career Center has specifically created over 20 documents to assist students on their career journey. PDF documents walk students through creating a profile on Handshake and using the system, writing cover letters, answering interview questions, and more. One of our most utilized documents in the <u>Career Center Library</u> is the downloadable and editable <u>resume</u> template that students can use to create their own resume.

Summer Internship Program

The <u>Summer Internship Program (SIP)</u> is a flagship program in the Career Center. SIP is a great opportunity for Tri-C students to match with a summer internship that will provide them with a wealth of professional experience in a structured setting with built-in onboarding, professional development, and networking opportunities. The Career Center pays the student for 100 hours of work, and we also cover the tuition for one summer course (up to 4 credit hours) and a \$125 stipend for one book for the summer course.
