| Student Profile Definition | Students who are eligible to participate in College Credit Plus as determined by state guidelines | Students who are not eligible for CCP, do not want their grade reported on the high school transcript or who want to take a class for personal enrichment. |
| Enrollment Process | <p>Same for state-pay or self-pay</p> <p>Self-pay option indicated on Authorization to Attend (ATA) form</p> <p>remoteccpchecklist.pdf (tri-c.edu)</p> | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Early admit students must: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Complete a Tri-C application - Submit transcript or middle school grade report and qualifying ACT/SAT scores to CCP office If student hasn't taken ACT/SAT tests, Tri-C's English and math placement tests can determine college readiness <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - English scores required; math scores may be required Accepted students contacted via email Request appointment with Tri-C counselor for course selection assistance |
| College Credit | <p>Credits earned during CCP must appear on both high school and college transcripts, regardless of grade or enrollment option</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Option A: Self-Pay <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Students choose to earn college and high school credit or college credit only (must inform school of choice) Option B: State-Pay <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Students earn college and high school credit | <p>Early admit courses are for college credit only. Grades do not appear on high school transcripts and cannot be counted as high school credit.</p> |
| Payment | <p>Final date to change election (Option A or B) is on or before College's no-fault withdrawal date</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Option A: Self-Pay <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Student/parent pays out of pocket and is responsible for all expenses, including textbooks - Students choose to earn college credit and high school credit or college credit only (must inform school of choice) - Students must elect this option when registering for courses Option B: State-Pay <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - All college course tuition, fees and textbooks paid for by State of Ohio - Students earn college credit <i>and</i> high school credit - Students must indicate tentative plan on Intent to Participate form <p>Option B is default option for CCP</p> <p>Students may be asked to confirm election of Option B during College advising process</p> | <p>Early admit students are responsible for all costs, including textbooks.</p> |
| Grades | Grades are available to students on <i>my Tri-C space</i> and to school administrators electronically via the Tri-C CCP Schedule and Grade report. | Grades are available to students on <i>my Tri-C space</i> . |
