

Shaquira Johnson is Chief Revenue Officer for Boys & Girls Clubs of Northeast Ohio, the organization formed in 2019 by the merger of Clubs in Cuyahoga, Summit, Lorain and Erie counties. The Cleveland native, who has been a vice president at KeyBank and has more than 20 years of banking experience, transitioned to the nonprofit world when she joined BGCNEO in September 2020.

Johnson, who grew up in Cleveland's Buckeye-Shaker area and now lives in the Mount Pleasant neighborhood, has been involved in the

local Clubs as a board member since 2009, when she joined the Bridge Board of Boys & Girls Clubs of Cleveland, a young professional's group. She was appointed to the BGCC Board of Directors and then to the BGCNEO board following the merger.

Boys & Girls Clubs are safe, fun places for kids ages 6 to 18 to go after school with a focus on academic success, healthy lifestyles and character development. BGCNEO is now one of the largest Boys & Girls Clubs organizations in the country.

Johnson came to BGCNEO from KeyBank, where she had served as a vice president and led Business Banking change management efforts by driving the development of strategic initiatives and execution of sales programs. She joined KeyBank in 2006 and has held management positions at both KeyBank and MBNA America (now Bank of America).

Johnson completed her term as president of both the National Black MBA Association Cleveland Chapter and Hawken Alumni Board in 2018. She has been engaged with the Hawken Alumni Board for more than 15 years. She is also a member of Lift Him Up Apostolic Faith Church.

In 2018, Johnson was recognized as one of Crain's Cleveland Business's "Power Players: Notable Women in Finance" for her contributions to KeyBank and her community. She is also a 2009 inductee into Kaleidoscope's 40/40 Club.
