CMA Up Close — Materials and Processes

Presented by the Cleveland Museum of Art

This course will offer insights into artists' materials and processes and how museum professionals conserve and exhibit art. Hear from conservators, preparators, curators and educators on the materials, making, care and display of art. Individual session topics include how Japanese artists used Chinese forms and techniques to bring Japanese porcelain into the modern era; the challenges of exhibiting contemporary paper works, such as recent prints and drawing acquisitions; and discussions on other parts of the museum's permanent collection and rotating exhibitions.

CMA Up Close — Traveling Through Landscapes

Presented by the Cleveland Museum of Art

Artists have depicted landscapes for centuries, and the genre continues to captivate audiences. The landscapes of certain regions — geographic, political and social — have also influenced artists in terms of subject matter, materials and style. In this course, participants can explore artists' depictions of landscapes and the diversity of peoples, traditions and artistic expressions across many lands.
