CMA Up Close — Heritage and Cultural Identities

Presented by the Cleveland Museum of Art

This six-session course will explore the connection between past traditions and contemporary identities of artists worldwide. The session topics will include the ceramic work of Rose B. Simpson; the special exhibition, *Korean Couture: Generations of Revolution*; the creativity of Jewish artists as they adapt traditional forms of Judaica to changing fashions, styles and needs; and the photography exhibition, *Picturing the Border*.
