

# Step 5: Let's get registered!

- Click "Continue" at the bottom of the screen.
- Sign in to your account using your S-Number and password.

# Step 6: Set up your authentication.

Once your password is established, you will be required to set up multi-factor authentication (MFA) to access certain Tri-C applications and tools. Federal regulations require the College to use MFA. In order to authenticate, enter your student email address (S#@acad.tri-c.edu) and your password. A code will appear on the screen. If you have the app, use this code. If not, click "I cannot use the app right now." You will then be able to send yourself a code via a phone call, text message or email.

# Step 7: Make your payment.

- Choose "Credit Card" as your payment method.
- Enter your card information.\*
- Click "Submit," then wait for the confirmation screen. You'll receive an email once your registration and payment are processed.

# Step 8: Watch for your welcome email.


