How To Register Online

Step 1: Do you have a Tri-C student number (S-Number)?

- **Yes, and I got it within the past year:** Proceed to Step 2.
- **Yes, but I got it more than a year ago:** Complete the online noncredit registration form to update your profile and activate your S-Number before registering. Visit tri-c.edu/NCRegistration.
- **No:** Complete the online noncredit registration form to receive your S-Number. Visit tri-c.edu/NCRegistration. You will receive your student number in your personal email within five to seven business days.

Before you begin: Make sure you have your course selections, S-Number and password ready. You'll need the CRN and course title for each course.

Step 5: Let's get registered!

- Go to tri-c.edu/encore. Look for our most recent "how-to-register" video!
 - Choose your desired location or program area.
 - Click the Bundle button or choose your course by clicking on the course name.
 - Click "Add to Cart" on the bundle page.
 - Select your desired courses by clicking the radio buttons next to the course names.
 - If you want to add another bundle to your cart (Winter and Spring can be added at the same time), click "Continue Shopping" and repeat the steps above.
 - Sign in to your account using your S-Number and password.

Step 6: Set up your authentication.

Once your password is established, you will be required to set up multi-factor authentication (MFA) to access certain Tri-C applications and tools. Federal regulations require the College to use MFA. Visit tri-c.edu/encoremfa for detailed instructions, and contact the Tri-C Help Desk with any questions at 216-987-4357 or HelpDesk@tri-c.edu.

In order to authenticate, enter your student email address (S#@acad.tri-c.edu) and your password. A code will appear on the screen. If you have the app, use this code. If not, click "I cannot use the app right now." You will then be able to send yourself a code via a phone call, text message or email.

Step 7: Make your payment.

- Choose "Credit Card" as your payment method.
 - Enter your card information.*
 - Click "Submit," then wait for the confirmation screen. You'll receive an email once your registration and payment are processed.

You will receive a welcome email two to three business days before the term begins with the course room numbers, parking information and other important details.

The James W. Day Sr. Trust is happy to be donating \$25,000 for students' tuition to attend the winter session of the Encore program at Tri-C's Western Campus in 2026. This gift will enable up to 250 students to enroll in the winter classes for free.

James W. Day served for 10 years as a Parma City Council member and slightly more than five years as the city's mayor. Then, in 1967, he began his career at the Higbee's Company, serving as vice president of real estate and public affairs. He retired in 1987.

Among his many accomplishments, Day served for many years as campaign chairman for Padua Franciscan High School. He was also president of the Warehouse District and the Settlers Landing Project.

The Western Campus has been a great neighbor to the James W. Day Park. At one time, the College and the park were located on the same property. Mayor James W. Day and Congressman Michael Feighan collaborated to acquire the land where the Western Campus is now located.

Three generations of the Day family have attended classes at the Western Campus. His son, James Day Sr., and his granddaughter have all benefited personally and professionally from attending continuing classes at the College.

The Day family hopes the students will enjoy their monetary gift to the Western Campus Encore program for the Winter Session. Any remaining funds not used for tuition will be given to the Encore program.

The Shrine of St. Stanislaus

The twin spires reaching 232 feet high were severely damaged by a tornado in 1909. Within the church are numerous sacred relics, a fragment of the True Cross and relics of saints, including Pope John Paul II and others.




