Charles Burchfield: The Ohio Landscapes, 1915-1920

Britany Salsbury, Associate Curator of Prints and Drawings

Join Britany Salsbury for a tour and discussion of an exhibition that explores the key role Northeast Ohio played in the art and life of American artist Charles Burchfield. The exhibit features about 30 drawings made between 1915 and 1920, the period surrounding what Burchfield described as his "golden year." Using the Midwestern landscape to express universal emotions and moods, he experimented with watercolor in his hometown of Salem, Ohio, as well as in Cleveland, where he attended the Cleveland School (now Institute) of Art. Through watercolor, Burchfield developed a new abstract style that came to define his work, even after he left Ohio in 1921.
