Across six sessions focused on collection objects and special exhibitions at the Cleveland Museum of Art (CMA), participants will learn how environments — natural, humanmade, political and social — and their changes have influenced artists' choices. We will look at the influences on subject matter, materials, processes and style. Individual session topics will include the symbolic use of nature in European Renaissance art; the archaeological origins of ancient works in the museum's collection; the artistic use and conservation of natural materials; how the natural environment of southern China influenced artistic production; how photography depicted the changing social and political landscape of 20th- and 21st-century China; and how the urban setting of Paris and its working-class populace inspired the art of Edgar Degas. The course includes visits to CMA's special exhibitions, China's Southern Paradise: Treasures From the Lower Yangzi Delta and

Degas and the Laundress: Women, Work and Impressionism, a special session featuring the Education Art Collection and guest speakers from the conservation and curatorial departments.

Stick around for the famous Polish Festival at 4 p.m. and enjoy authentic food and music from Poland's finest.

Sanctuary Museum (formerly the Museum of the Statues)

Woodland Cemetery

The historical Woodland Cemetery, founded in 1853, holds the heart of Cleveland's most important growth. The history of the Underground Railroad is told through its residents, including Dr. David Long, the first Cleveland physician who founded the first antislavery society, Black barber John Brown, a conductor and station master, and Lucy Bagby, the last fugitive slave tried and returned under the Fugitive Slave Law before the Civil War. Their stories show Black and white united in a common goal to end slavery and save Freedom Seekers. Bring good walking shoes to meet these men and women throughout the 60-plus acres in the heart of the city. Dorothy Salem, educational outreach coordinator at Woodland Cemetery, will lead the tour.

Soldiers' and Sailors' Monuments

The tour will consist of a walk around the exterior statuary (weather depending) and a tour of the interior Memorial Room. You will learn about Cleveland's connection to the Civil War through the 9,000 names of men and women who served in the cause to end slavery in the United States, as well as the construction of the monument and the vision of the architect and sculptor, Levi T. Scofield. The monument is a unique combination of a tablet containing the names of soldiers and sailors and an obelisk listing the major battles of the Civil War. A handicap lift is available.
