



JACK, JOSEPH AND MORTON MANDEL HUMANITIES CENTER

FACULTY FELLOWS PROGRAM 2019 -2020

The Jack, Joseph and Morton Mandel Humanities Center at Cuyahoga Community College (Tri-C®) invites applications and nominations for its inaugural Faculty Fellows program. Faculty from all disciplines are encouraged to apply.

This competitive fellowship is a one-year appointment (fall and spring semesters) that comes with a \$1,000 honorarium/stipend, research support up to \$1,500 and three ESUs. Mandel Faculty Fellows will engage in scholarly work that advances the Mandel Center's mission of promoting interdisciplinary research that leads to meaningful public engagement.

Applicants or nominees should propose projects that integrate the value and/or methods of the humanities with their professional programs, regardless of discipline. Proposals should identify clear outcomes for the project (e.g., a public event, a scholarly publication, professional training). Proposals that explicitly engage with the public policy areas identified in the *Stokes: Honoring the Past, Inspiring the Future* document (housing, health, safety, education and economic parity) are preferred.

Up to two fellowships will be awarded each academic year. Fellows will present their work at the Jack, Joseph and Morton Mandel Faculty Fellows event at the end of the academic year.

Applications and nominations are solicited from any tenured or tenure-track faculty member **across the disciplines.**

The application deadline for the fellowship period August 2019 – May 2020 is **5 p.m. on Friday, March 8.** Fellows will be announced at College-wide convocation at the conclusion of the Spring 2019 semester.

Application process includes:

- Completion of online application at www.tri-c.edu/mandelfacultyfellows.
- Abstract of project or intended research (150-250 words).
- Narrative that addresses the way(s) in which the project integrates the humanities with the applicant's field or discipline and explains the expected outcome(s) of the project (approximately 750 words).
