

Attention Full-Time Faculty:

Core Curriculum Refresher Course

As part of the current CCC-AAUP contract, full-time faculty have agreed to participate in the Workplace Core Curricula. This includes the following five seminars:

- 1. Legal Issues/Harassment and Discrimination
- 2. Student Affairs Code of Conduct
- 3. Civility
- 4. Workplace Safety and Violence
- 5. Student Success

Faculty who completed all five modules during a previous contract cycle only need to complete the Core Curriculum Refresher Course. Faculty have through the end of the 2022-2025 contract cycle to complete the three-hour refresher (offered asynchronously in Blackboard) and earn five service credits.
