

COLLEGE CREDIT PLUS

College Credit Plus (CCP) allows eligible students to earn high school and college credit that will appear on both their high school and college transcripts.

- CCP eligibility, Tri-C admission and placement determined using ACT, SAT or Tri-C placement test scores.
- Students are simultaneously enrolled in college and high school courses, earning credit for both, which could include earning an associate degree, even an Associate of Arts 100% online.
- Students are not charged for college fees, approved textbooks or lab fees unless otherwise stipulated.

- Students in grades 7 through 12 who meet eligibility requirements can participate in CCP.
- Students are limited to 30 credit hours per year (starting with the summer term), with a cap of 120 credit hours for the duration of the program.
- Courses can be taken on a college campus, online, and/or at the student's high school.

TO RECEIVE CREDIT FROM TRI-C, A STUDENT MUST:

- Visit <u>tri-c.edu/ccp</u> for information or <u>tri-c.</u> <u>edu/apply</u> to complete the CCP application.
- Submit high school transcript or middle school grade report or eligible test scores from a state-approved exam to determine eligibility.
- Be accepted to CCP and Tri-C.
- Meet with high school and Tri-C counselors to ensure proper course selection.
- Pass the course with a grade of D or better (a C grade may be required to meet prerequisites for additional courses).
- Take Tri-C placement tests (if applicable).

CAREER-TECHNICAL CREDIT TRANSFER



The Ohio Department of Higher Education (ODHE) and the Ohio Department of Education (ODE) collaborated to ensure students at secondary or adult career-technical institutions could transfer approved, agreed-upon courses to Ohio's public two- and four-year institutions that offer curriculum aligned to a CTAG (noncredit to credit).

- Students who complete an approved course/program and pass all requirements, including any credentialing or licensing exam(s), are eligible for college credit at any Ohio public college or university that offers that course/program.
- There is no cost to the student, the school, the technical center or the college/university for CTAG credit.
- Grades do not transfer credit does. Credit will only be posted to the student's transcript after the student has applied and been accepted to Tri-C.
- Credit expiration time limits vary by program.
- You have up to three years after high school graduation to access CTAG credit.

TO RECEIVE CREDIT FROM TRI-C, A STUDENT MUST:

- Apply for admission and enroll at Tri-C.
- Successfully complete the course/ program and all assessments, as required.
- Students must grant permission to have a college or university post CTAG credit when they take the End-of-Course Exam.
- For some programs, a Non-CTAV
 Verification Form must be submitted along with appropriate documentation in order to receive course credit.

 The programs that require this form usually require a license or certificate, and they are listed on the form itself. Please visit tri-c.edu/verificationforms for more information.

 If a form is required, the Tri-C Office of the Registrar must receive the completed form directly from the career technical institution.

 If permission is granted or the Verification Form is received, credit will be posted to the academic record of the student. The Office of the Registrar will send a notice to the student's Tri-C email address once the credit has been posted.

OHIO COLLEGE TECH PREP

TECH PREP ARTICULATION AGREEMENTS

Tech Prep articulation agreements create a seamless curriculum pathway that starts in high school, leads to an associate degree and prepares students for careers in related technical fields.

- Requires a formal agreement between career center/high school career tech program and Tri-C.
- Only students who have completed approved Career Tech programs are eligible for the articulation agreements.
- Career Tech students can also earn college credit through CCP and CTAG.
- The credit outlined in the specific articulation agreement is posted to a student's Tri-C transcript.

- Tech Prep credit is a form of Credit for Prior Learning. Students do not receive a formal grade.
- Other institutions will determine if Tech Prep credits will transfer to their institution.
- There is no cost to the student, the career center/high school or Tri-C for articulated credits.
- Students have one year after high school graduation to submit required paperwork.

EXAMINATION CREDIT

Receive credit for Advanced Placement (AP), International Baccalaureate (IB) and College-Level Examination Program (CLEP) exam scores. Submit an application for Tri-C admission to receive official confirmation of how this credit will apply.

These options offer cost savings and may shorten time to degree completion for students.

AP

High school students who complete AP courses and receive a score of 3 or better on corresponding exams are guaranteed college credit, allowing them to skip certain introductory college courses.

IB

High school students who participate in the Diploma Programme must complete the course and take the corresponding exam. College credit may be awarded depending on the course and the exam score.

To receive credit from Tri-C, students must:

Have the College Board send AP test score(s) or have official IB transcripts sent to:

CLEP

Students can earn college credit for what they already know by receiving qualifying scores on any of 33 CLEP exams.


