The adjacent courses are suggested for students interested in transferring to a four-year university, after earning their Associate of Arts degree, to pursue a Bachelor of Arts degree in Art. Students following this degree pathway will earn an Associate of Arts degree from Cuyahoga Community College.

Completion of this degree pathway does not guarantee admission to the four-year program of your choice, nor admission at the junior level. Be sure to consult with a representative at your university of choice regarding admission requirements and transferability of specific courses. This guide is provided solely for convenience and completion of the Associate of Arts degree; **be sure to work closely with your Tri-C counselor and representatives at your intended transfer school.**

IMPORTANT NOTES:

- The degree earned by using this guide will be labelled Associate of Arts. The specific area of emphasis (ART) is not included on the Associate of Arts degree/diploma nor on student transcripts.
- Your English and Math placement scores will determine the classes you must take in those course sequences. Placement at a level lower than the initial English and Math courses listed in this guide will likely delay your completion of this degree pathway. Meet with a counselor at your campus to discuss options.
- Students should take courses in the Ohio Transfer Module (OTM) for all associate degree required areas, and approved Transfer Assurance Guide (TAG) courses when possible.
- Students who complete the entire Ohio Transfer Module and graduate will complete the general education requirements at many Ohio public and private institutions.
- **This suggested degree pathway is intended as a guide only.** Each student's path is unique, and no single course sequence will serve all purposes. To ensure that your course selections will meet your transfer needs, be sure to:
 - Meet with a Tri-C counselor to choose appropriate courses to achieve your transfer goals.
 - Speak with an admissions representative at your intended transfer university.
 - Contact the department of your intended major at your intended transfer university to discuss that program's specific requirements.
 - **Check the Tri-C Transfer Center webpage** where you will find Articulation Agreements with a number of four-year institutions. The Agreements show requirements and seamless Transfer Pathways specific to various programs at those institutions.
 - **If an Articulation Agreement exists for your intended transfer school and program, use it instead of this Area of Emphasis guide.**
 - If an Articulation Agreement does not exist, use this Area of Emphasis guide but keep in mind that electives are typically best decided by the transfer school to meet their institutional requirements.
