Welcome to the English as a Second Language (ESL) department at Tri-C. When you successfully complete and pass ESL 1310, 1321, and 1331 or ESL 1510, 1520, 1530, and 1540, you are eligible to take ENG 1010 (College Composition I) and other courses in your major.

Many students study full-time. That means that you take all three courses in a level in the same semester. If you need to attend classes part-time (1 or 2 courses in a semester), you always need to take the Grammar course for the level during your first semester of studying a new level.
