

FMFAA Mentoring Program: Stole and Scholarship Eligibility

To receive a graduation stole and be considered for FMFAA scholarships, students must earn 20 or more points during the current academic year.

Point collection period: August through April of each year

Eligibility Point Breakdown

- 2 Points: Each mentor meeting (in person, virtual or phone). Mentees and mentors must meet at least once a month.
- 5 Points: Mandatory FMFAA events (will be labeled "Mandatory" via email).
- 3 Points: Non-mandatory FMFAA events.
- 2 Points per hour: Volunteering in the FMFAA office or at approved events. Examples include:
 - Office support (information desk, clerical work, marketing, social media)
 - Event setup/breakdown or serving as a student greeter

- 8 points: FMFAA Academic Plan in DegreeWorks
 - Every mentee must have an active and updated academic plan.
