

Transfer Credits from Cuyahoga Community College District

Effective from August 20, 2020 to May 25, 2025

DeVry University has developed this Degree Program Transfer Guide to assist students transferring from Cuyahoga Community College District to DeVry. This guide doesn't represent all courses required for DeVry programs; rather, it provides a list of courses that, when completed at Cuyahoga Community College District, may transfer to DeVry. This guide is based on a review of Cuyahoga Community College District courses by DeVry as of 8/20/20 and is subject to review and modification at any time and without prior notice. Limitations and restrictions may apply.

The Technical Management bachelor's degree program is included in this guide.

Process

Applicants seeking to transfer credit must:

1. Request a formal credit evaluation prior to beginning the first class at DeVry University; and
2. Provide to DeVry an official transcript from the institution where the credit was earned.

Please see a DeVry University admissions representative to request a transfer credit evaluation. Transfer credit is considered on an individual basis and awarded only upon receipt of an official transcript.

Limitations and Restrictions

Admission and transfer credit applicability are subject but not limited to DeVry University's admission requirements, program requirements, and academic policies, including but not limited to the external transfer credit policy. Additional state-specific requirements for transfer credit acceptance may apply.

Please note the following:

- A grade of C (70%) or higher is required for all transfer credits to DeVry University. Courses accepted in transfer may not be applicable to the academic program chosen by the student.
- The number of credits granted for any course equivalency may not exceed the number on the transcript associated with the transfer course.
- Curriculum changes at either institution may affect transferability and applicability of certain credits. A time limit may be imposed on the ability to transfer credits for some courses, especially those in technical or evolving areas.

All courses selection, as noted in bold, must be upper-division (e.g., 300-400 level) to meet the 42 credit hours of upper-division coursework requirement.

*Students who place into Statistics (MATH-1410) and successfully complete the course receive credit for that course. If they successfully complete Contemporary Mathematics as well, this credit is applied to elective requirements. Students who have met the statistics requirement may take an elective in this semester.

^To meet the 42 credit hours of upper-division coursework requirement, students take one of the following: HUMN303, HUMN451, HIST405, HIST410, LAWS310, or POLI330.

~The minimum credits required to award the degree is 122. Students following this plan earn 124 as needed to satisfy the 42 credit hour upper-division coursework requirement.
