This program awards maximum credit for an associate degree from Cuyahoga Community College, streamlining completion of a bachelor's degree from *Franklin* University. A maximum of 94 credits transfer to *Franklin* from Tri-C. (Tri-C courses taken after associate degree completion may not be eligible for financial aid, see Counseling Center or Financial Aid Office for details.) We can utilize the Consortium agreement between Franklin University and Tri-C to assist students in using FAFSA aid to cover their additional Tri-C coursework beyond their associates degree.

## All students must complete:

- A minimum of **120** semester credits (combined Tri-C and Franklin
- Meet all residency requirements (30 credits for Franklin)
