

Addendum
to the
Articulation Agreement
by and between
Kent State University Honors College and Cuyahoga Community College

This Addendum to the Articulation Agreement (“Addendum”) entered into on March 15, 2018 (the “Effective Date”) by Kent State University Honors College (“University”), with an address of Kent, OH 44242; and Cuyahoga Community College (“College”), with an address of 700 Carnegie Avenue, Cleveland, OH 44115-2878, collectively referred to as the “Parties.”

WHEREAS, University and College entered into an Articulation Agreement effective March 15, 2018 (“Agreement”);

WHEREAS, the Parties wish to amend the Agreement.


NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the promises and mutual covenants contained in this Agreement, and of other good and valuable consideration, the receipt and sufficiency of which are hereby acknowledged, the Parties agree as follows:

1. Designated representatives from each institution will confer annually to review this Addendum as necessary, based on curriculum and program changes.
2. Courses not listed on the articulation agreement will transfer to Kent State University according to the Transfer of Undergraduate Credit policy listed in the Kent State catalog. See <http://catalog.kent.edu/> for the full academic policy, and www.kent.edu/transferguide for a listing of additional courses already reviewed by the Kent State faculty. Many courses will transfer as part of the Ohio Transfer to Degree Guarantee. For more information please visit <https://transfercredit.ohio.gov/>. Courses not listed on the Transfer Guide can be reviewed to see if there is an equivalent course in the Kent State catalog. If no equivalency can be determined, a student will receive elective credit for all successfully completed non-remedial coursework.
3. As of the Effective Date of this Amendment, Attachment A is hereby replaced with the Attachment A, attached hereto and incorporated herein.
4. Except as modified by this Amendment, the Articulation Agreement shall remain in full force and effect.



Articulation Criteria and Articulation Benefits

1. The standard articulation criteria (“Articulation Criteria”) are:

- a. Achieving a minimum overall cumulative grade point average of 3.5.
- b. Completion of an Associate Degree or Credit Hour Equivalent (60 credits) preferred.
- c. Enrollment in Honors Program and completion of one designated Honors course at the College*.
- d. Completion of a Kent State University Honors College Application Essay.
- e. Formal acceptance into Kent State University’s Honors College. See current Honors College steps to admission at <https://www.kent.edu/honors/continuing-transfer-students>.

**NOTE: Distance-learning (100% online) courses are not eligible for acceptance as Kent State Honors College courses.*

2. The articulation benefits (“Articulation Benefits”) are:

- a. College Honors course credits with a grade of “C” and above and which are not distance- learning (100% online) courses will transfer as equivalent to Kent State Honors College courses.
- b. Eligibility to participate in Honors College programs at Kent State.
- c. Advising provided for acceptance, registration and degree requirement completion for Honors College students.
- d. Eligibility for Honors financial support for thesis or off-campus study. Utilization of transfer coursework along with Kent State coursework and Kent State G.P.A. for the determination of Honors College graduation status (i.e., Honors College Scholar or Graduation with Department, General or University Honors).
