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Step Forward Introduces New Water Assistance Program

The **Low Income Household Water Assistance Program (LIHWAP)** assists eligible residents with water and wastewater bills.

Eligible residents must be

- At or below 175% of the federal poverty guidelines.
- Have a disconnection notice or have been disconnected.
- In the process of establishing a new service.
- Paying to transfer service.



Note: Residents with a current medical certificate on file with their utility are ineligible to receive LIHWAP assistance until the medical certificate protection expires.

To apply for the program, clients are required to schedule an appointment. For appointment scheduling call, **(216) 350-8008** or visit **stepforward.itfrontdesk**. Due to technical difficulties with online scheduling, applicants should temporarily select "*Winter Crisis*" within the appointment scheduling system. Appointments are available Monday through Friday from 8:00 a.m. until 4:00 p.m. Walk-ins will not be accepted.

Phlebotomy Technician

Phlebotomy Technicians are integral part of the medical laboratory team. Their primary function is to collect blood from patients and prepare the sample for testing. Most work in hospitals and clinics, but some collect blood for donation purposes. Phlebotomy technicians are important members of the health care team and also the lab team. They must create an atmosphere of trust and confidence with patients while drawing blood specimens in a skillful, safe, and reliable manner. Successful phlebotomy technicians must like challenge and responsibility. They must be accurate, work well under pressure, and communicate effectively. According to the Bureau of Labor Statistics, employment for phlebotomy technicians is expected to grow about 17% over the next 10 years.

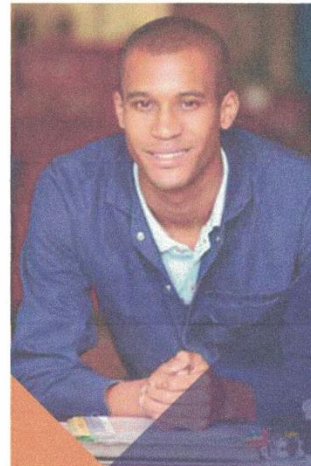

NON-TIPPED EMPLOYEES

**A Minimum Wage of
\$9.30 per hour**

“Non-Tipped Employees” includes any employee who does not engage in an occupation in which he/she customarily and regularly receives more than thirty dollars (\$30.00) per month in tips.

“Employers” who gross less than \$342,000 shall pay their employees no less than the current federal minimum wage rate.

“Employees” under the age of 16 shall be paid no less than the current federal minimum wage rate.

“Current Federal Minimum Wage” is \$7.25 per hour.

TIPPED EMPLOYEES

**A Minimum Wage of
\$4.65 per hour PLUS TIPS**

“Tipped Employees” includes any employee who engages in an occupation in which he/she customarily and regularly receives more than thirty dollars (\$30.00) per month in tips. Employers electing to use the tip credit provision must be able to show that tipped employees receive at least the minimum wage when direct or cash wages and the tip credit amount are combined.



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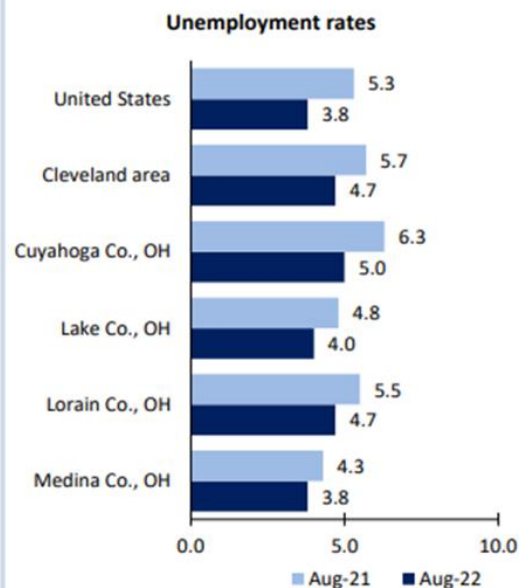

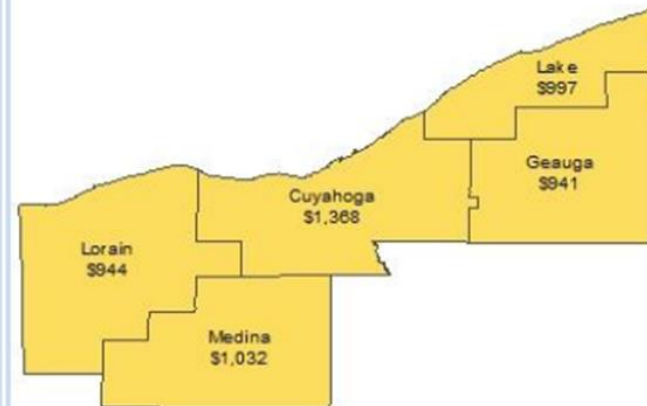
Unemployment rates for the nation and selected areas

Living Wage Calculation for Cuyahoga County, Ohio

The living wage shown is the hourly rate that an individual in a household must earn to support his or herself and their family. The assumption is the sole provider is working full-time (2080 hours per year). The tool provides information for individuals, and households with one or two working adults



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and zero to three children. In the case of households with two working adults, all values are per working adult, single or in a family unless otherwise noted.

The state minimum wage is the same for all individuals, regardless of how many dependents they may have. Data are updated annually, in the first quarter of the new year. State minimum wages are determined based on the posted value of the minimum wage as of January one of the coming year (National Conference of State Legislatures, 2019). The poverty rate reflects a person's gross annual income. We have converted it to an hourly wage for the sake of comparison.
