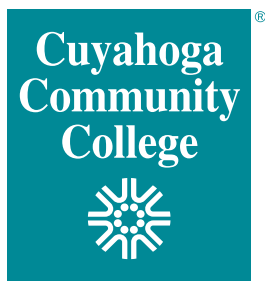

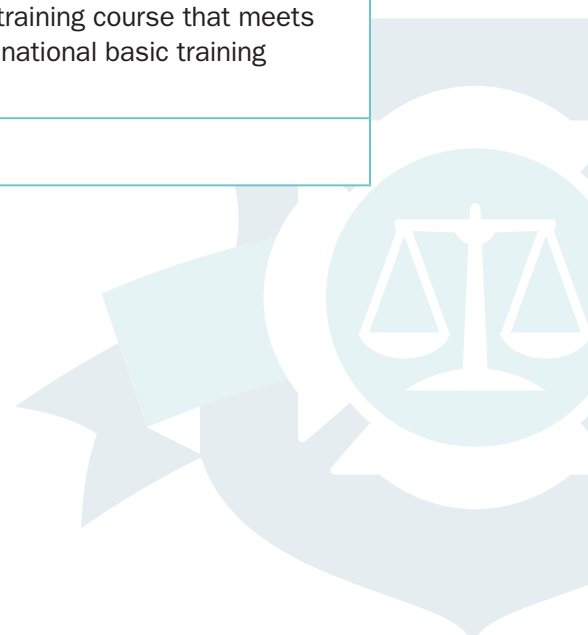

Upon completion, participants will be qualified to take the state exam.</p> <p>Note: Workout clothing is necessary for subject control skills.</p>

Curriculum builds on foundational topics such as communication skills, call-taking and radio techniques and incorporates the most up-to-date information on technology and work-related issues in public safety communications centers.</p> <p>Hands-on training consists of keyboarding; listening and responding to actual 911 and non-emergency calls; skill-building exercises in listening, multitasking, information gathering and decision making; entering calls using computer aided dispatching (CAD); and dispatching and clearing calls.</p>
